Welcome to Scramble #12: North Cascades at Bridge Creek! We're all so excited to meet you all and spend a week in the great outdoors together. We wanted to let you know what to expect from the trip, lay out all the logistics, and introduce ourselves.

## What to Expect (When You're Expecting) (an Awesome Trip)

**Plan to arrive at Whitman by 1 PM on August 20th.** We'll start the week off with a group meeting in the Ballroom of the Reid Campus Center. We'll then break apart into our individual Scrambles to pack, play some get-to-know-each-other games, and eat dinner. You'll be able to store your stuff in Anderson Hall storage while we're in the backcountry. We'll all sleep at Whitman that night and take off the next morning for the great outdoors.

## Our trip itinerary:

- Aug 20: Arrive at Whitman by 1 PM and meet at the Reid Campus Center; sleep at Whitman.
- Aug 21: Drive from Whitman to the North Cascades; sleep at Lone Fir Campground.
- Aug 22: 3.4 mi from Bridge Creek Trailhead to Fireweed Camp.
- Aug 23: 4.1 mi to McAlester Lake Camp. An "up day"—we're heading up about 2000 ft.
- Aug 24: 5.5 mi downhill to Bench Creek Camp along Rainbow Creek.
- Aug 25: 3.0 mi to Rainbow Meadows Camp through Rainbow Meadows. A half-up day we're going up about 1500 ft.
- Aug 26: 9.5 mi to Hideaway Camp. Our longest day, starting with a trek up over a saddle and then down into the South Fork Bridge Creek valley.
- Aug 27: 4.7 mi to Bridge Creek Trailhead and drive back to Whitman. We'll get up early to make it back by 3 PM. Scramble picnic at 6pm. Check into Residence Halls after picnic.

**We'll get back to Whitman by 3 PM on August 27th.** We'll then unpack and clean up until the big Scramble dinner and closing event at 6 PM on the Reid side lawn. That night you'll be able to check into and then sleep in your new dorm room, though you won't be able to access storage until the next morning. Move-in day for all Scramblers is August 28th.

Our goals for the trip include: having fun, getting to know each other, seeing beautiful places in the backcountry, having lots of fun, answering your questions about Whitman, making yummy food, and having tons and tons of fun. If you know any good get-to-know-each-other games or card games, make sure to introduce us to them!
