#### **Commencement Address and Honorary Degree Recipient – Sally Jewell**

Sally Jewell is the 51<sup>st</sup> Secretary of the Interior. The U.S. Department of the Interior serves as steward for approximately 20 percent of the nation's lands, including national parks, national wildlife refuges, and other public lands; oversees the responsible development of conventional and renewable energy supplies on public lands and waters; is the largest supplier and manager of water in the 17 Western states; and upholds trust responsibilities to the 566 federally recognized American Indian tribes and Alaska Natives. Prior to her confirmation, Jewell served as President and Chief Executive Officer of Recreation Equipment, Inc. (REI). Before joining REI, Jewell spent 19 years as a commercial banker, first as an energy and natural resources expert and later working with a diverse array of businesses that drive our nation's economy. An avid outdoorswoman, Jewell enjoys skiing, kayaking, hiking and other activities in the Pacific Northwest. She is a graduate of the University of Washington and resides in Seattle.

#### Honorary Degree Recipient – Robert Manning '88

A renowned aerospace engineer, Robert "Rob" Manning has been the Mars Exploration Program Chief Engineer at NASA's Jet Propulsions Laboratory in Pasadena, California, since 2004. In this role, Rob is responsible for ensuring that NASA's missions to Mars—including the Mars Rover mission in 2010—are successful. His team designed the Curiosity rover now exploring Mars. Prior to this role, Rob Manning led the "spacecraft" systems engineering team for the Mars Exploration Rover (MER) project that landed twin rovers, Spirit and Opportunity, on the surface of Mars in early 2004.

**Light Luncheon:** Immediately following Commencement, the College will host a light luncheon for graduating seniors, families, guests, staff and faculty between Memorial and Penrose Library (Sherwood Center in case of rain). Members of the faculty are encouraged to attend this event.

**EXTREME WEATHER PLAN:** Extreme Weather is defined as conditions which are unsafe, such as severe winds, lightning or hail, as opposed to conditions which are uncomfortable such as rain, heat or cold. In the event of Extreme Weather, the Commencement ceremony will take place at 12:00 p.m. in Cordiner Hall. Faculty seating on the Cordiner stage will be on a first-come, first-served basis; there will be no processional or recessional. Faculty must be in academic regalia for admittance to Cordiner Hall. The signal for moving the ceremony inside will be the continuous ringing of the College bell at 10:30 a.m.
