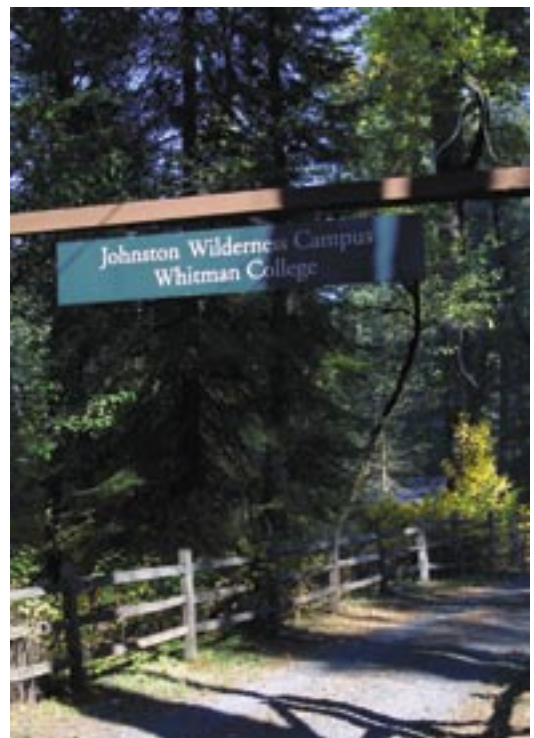




The Johnston Wilderness Campus
