Happy New Year! Here is the latest grants news:

IRIS Database now available: IRIS, a searchable database of funding opportunities from the University of Illinois Library, is now available. Anyone can access IRIS from a networked computer on the Whitman campus. In addition to searching over 9,000 funding opportunities, you can create your own IRIS search profile, which will alert you to upcoming funding opportunities in your areas of interest.

New compliance requirement: All NSF proposals submitted after January 4, 2010 must comply with a new requirement that all NSF-funded research students must undergo training in the responsible conduct of research (RCR). To fulfill this requirement, Whitman will require all students conducting NSF-funded research to take an online RCR tutorial in the field in which they are working. The online tutorial can be found at:

<https://www.citiprogram.org/default.asp?language=english>. Faculty mentors will be responsible for certifying that their students have fulfilled the requirement. If you are planning to submit an NSF grant next semester, please contact the FCR office to find out more about Whitman's policy.

Required forms for submitting a grant: To help maximize the efficiency of our grant submission procedures, please submit these forms to the Office of FCR at the beginning of the grant preparation process (at least one month before the due date):


- [Proposal Development Form](#) (a checklist to make sure all procedures have been followed), signed by your department and division chairs, and the Provost.
- [Matching Funds Request Form](#), if the grant proposal will require matching funds from the College (e.g., for building renovations, equipment maintenance contracts, staff support, course reduction). You must include a budget request and a rationale indicating how this grant would serve to advance the academic mission of the College. The Provost, along with the Committee of Division Chairs (if necessary) will make the final decision.

Fulbright Ambassador to visit campus: We are happy to report that Fulbright Ambassador Everette Penn, Associate Professor of Criminology at the Univ. of Houston-Clear Lake, will visit Whitman on April 7. Fulbright Ambassadors are Fulbright Scholar alumni who travel to campuses promoting the Fulbright Program.
