To Whitman College Applicants:

My colleagues and I on the Admission Committee are delighted you are considering Whitman College. We hope your application will celebrate your achievements and provide us insight into the unique story you have to share. As you complete your application, I offer a few words of advice.

Whitman seeks to build an intellectually-centered, diverse, and highly-engaged community of scholars. We seek curious, hard-working students who enjoy learning. We look for students with exceptional talents who have made a difference in their school and community. We strive to build a community that represents students from various ethnic, religious, socioeconomic, and geographic backgrounds. Whitman aims to foster diversity and respect for all of its community members.

The primary emphasis of our evaluation of your application is on your academic preparation. The Admission Committee also values active involvement in extracurricular activities. It is the balance between the academic excellence of our students and their engagement in the Whitman community that makes Whitman such an exciting experience. We will assess carefully the following in your application:

- the rigor of courses you have taken
- the grades earned in those courses
- the quality, depth, and voice of your writing
- the passion you have demonstrated in extracurricular activities and work
- the recommendations from your guidance counselor, advisor, teacher, or professor
- your SAT I or ACT scores

Our admission process is highly selective since we are unable to offer admission to all qualified applicants. Please know that members of our Admission Committee read each application with care and interest.

I hope this letter clarifies what we look for when we read your application and conveys our interest in you and your achievements. Finally, I recommend you take the time to interview with an admission officer during a campus visit or when we travel to your area. Although not required, we find the interview helps us get to know each student better and personalizes the admission process.

Completing Your Application

What forms do I need to file to complete an application for admission? See the Personal Checklists on the back page of this letter.

Can I apply online? Yes. We prefer that students apply online. Whitman is a member of the Common Application. You can apply at www.whitman.edu/content/admission or www.commonapp.org. In addition to the Common Application, the Whitman Supplement is required to complete your application.

What is the Whitman Supplement? The Whitman Supplement is intended to give the Admission Committee additional material that demonstrates your writing ability—a key component to academic success at Whitman. It also gives you the opportunity to provide additional information that you feel would be helpful for us to consider as we evaluate your application. This form can be found on the links listed above for the application. You will be required to submit the following with the Supplement form:

- A copy of a graded, analytical paper from a recent English class.
- A short answer statement on diversity

What are Whitman's deadline and notification dates? See the table above.

What is Early Decision? If Whitman is your first-choice college and you plan to enroll if you are admitted, then our Early Decision options I or II are designed for you. Once admitted, we ask you to withdraw applications pending elsewhere. We take this commitment seriously and expect that you will also.

Will I need to complete an additional form as an Early Decision candidate? Yes. You will need to complete the **Early Decision Agreement**. The agreement states that Whitman is your first-choice college, and, if admitted, you will attend Whitman — contingent upon receipt of an acceptable financial aid award — and withdraw all applications pending elsewhere.

What tests does Whitman require? Whitman requires either the **SAT I** or **ACT with writing** scores to complete an application for admission. The test score requirement is waived for transfer applicants who have completed two years of college coursework.

What tests do I need if I'm an international student? All international students must submit either the **SAT-I** or **ACT**, including the writing sections. Students whose native language is not English must also submit either the **IELTS** or **TOEFL**. We accept the internet-based or paper-based version of the **TOEFL**.

Does Whitman have a preference between the SAT I or the ACT? No. We accept both and treat them equally.

How does Whitman handle scores on different test dates? It is Whitman's policy to use the highest sub score of the SAT I, even if the highest scores are received on different test dates. We use the highest ACT composite score, too.

What if I submit both the SAT I and the ACT? When both SAT I and ACT scores are submitted, we record the best score using an equivalency table.

What is Whitman's CEEB code? 4951.

What is Whitman's ACT code? 4492.

What other forms will I need to submit as a transfer applicant? You must submit all parts of the application listed on our personal checklist for transfer applicants (see *back page*). Please note, in particular, that you must complete the **College Official's Report** form available on the Whitman and Common Application web sites.

Can I waive the School Report Form as a Transfer applicant? The School Report Form is waived if you have graduated from high school more than two years before the time of application or will have completed two or more years of college work by the time of enrollment at Whitman.

What other forms will I need to submit as an international applicant? As an international applicant, you must submit all parts of the application listed on our personal checklist for international students (see *back page*).

Can I enter Whitman mid-year? Yes. To apply for spring semester admission, you should submit all application materials by **November 15**. Your application will be acted upon immediately to allow you to have time to make your plans.

Financial Aid Information

What forms do I need to complete to apply for need-based financial aid? Domestic applicants must complete both the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** and the **College Scholarship Service (CSS) PROFILE**. International applicants must only complete the **CSS PROFILE**. Forms must be completed by the dates listed in the deadlines table.

What is Whitman's FAFSA code? 003803.

What is Whitman's CSS Profile code? 4951.

Where can I find the FAFSA and/or PROFILE forms?

The forms are available online at: fafsa.ed.gov and profileonline.collegeboard.com

Since much of the information needed to complete the FAFSA and PROFILE derives from income tax information, how can I file the forms if our tax forms have not been completed? In most cases, you and your family will not yet have completed your income tax return at the time you apply for financial aid. We recommend that you use estimated figures where you do not have precise information. Later, if actual figures differ greatly from your estimates, you will have the opportunity to make adjustments.

What happens if I submit my forms late? Since financial aid awards will have been made to those who file on time, financial aid funds may be limited for those who file late.

If I am not applying for need-based financial aid and would like to be considered for merit-based scholarships, do I need to file the FAFSA and the CSS PROFILE? No, you will automatically be considered for certain merit-based scholarships when you turn in your complete application. Additional materials or an audition may be required for some merit-based scholarships at Whitman. Please call our toll-free number, 1-877-462-9448, for details.
