Working & Volunteering Abroad

PRE-PLANNING CHECKLIST

Regardless of whether you are considering working abroad through an organization on this list or one that you find on your own, we urge you to be proactive in making sure the organization offers job placement and support services that suit your interests and needs, and that it is a legitimate operation.

To gauge the quality of a work abroad organization, we suggest you start with the following:

- Contact the program directly and ask them detailed questions about what they have to offer.
- Ask the program to supply names and contact information of past participants whom you can contact and question about their experience on the program.
- Contact the Better Business Bureau (<u>www.bbb.org</u>) to ascertain if there have been problems with the organization.
- Scrutinize all employment contracts carefully before signing, and ask your employer if you have any questions or concerns.
- Be sure you understand what support services the program provides, such as airport pick-up, housing, medical insurance, etc.
- Inquire with the program about whether you will need a work visa and if they help facilitate the processing of that visa.


