- o **Objective**: To ask if families' social status considerations played a role in declining workforce participation among women in India
- Methodology: I construct a household level theoretical model to arrive at stylized testable hypotheses; Test using a large, nationally representative panel dataset and an individual fixed effects model; Provide complementary evidence from social network analysis.
