## COVID-19 Safety Protocols for Visitors and Events

As a fully vaccinated campus, all visitors are required to provide proof of vaccination to access campus. There are different processes depending upon the type of visit or event.

The Conference, Events and Scheduling (CES) department provides assistance for single and multi-day events. The key to a successful event is **advanced planning**. Please submit your requests two weeks prior to the event. Every effort will be made to accommodate last minute requests; however, event support may be limited. To reserve spaces on campus, email [reservation@whitman.edu](mailto:reservation@whitman.edu) or fill out the online [Room Reservations Request Form](#).

Visitor vaccination verification:

- For **single-day events** (including meetings): any non-Whitman guests/participants attending from outside the Whitman community must supply proof of full COVID-19 vaccination. The event host is responsible for verifying each individual's vaccination status and ensuring that masks are worn.
- For **multi-day/multi-location events**: in addition to verifying vaccination status and wearing masks campus guests will receive a visitor pass and lanyard. The event host needs to fill out a [Visitor Badge Request Form](#) indicating the number of guests in attendance and verification of vaccination.

As in the past, CES will continue to be responsible for contracts for external organizations and non-profits hosting events at Whitman.
