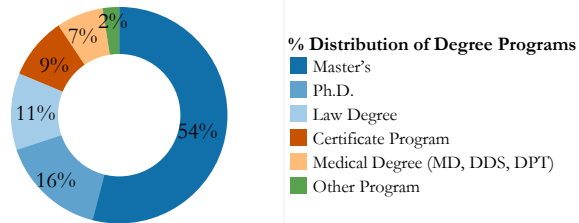


Whitman Alumni Survey: 2018-2020 Combined Report of One, Five, and Ten Years Out Graduates

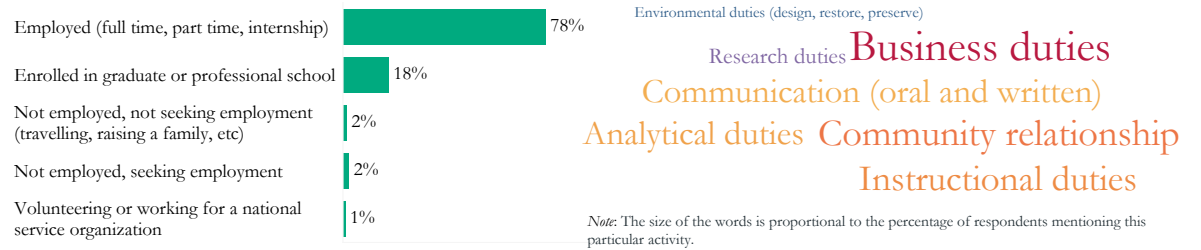
Education After Whitman

Data from the National Student Clearinghouse suggests that ~65% of Whitman graduates eventually earn an additional degree. Below we report the degrees our alumni listed.



Current Primary Activity

The majority of respondents indicated that they are employed and have a full time, part-time, or an internship position. Also, they indicated in an open-ended question the description of their job duties.



Impactful activities at Whitman

Respondents were asked to describe the most significant and impactful activities in which they participated while attending Whitman. Below we report the main ones mentioned by our alumni.



Note: The size of the words is proportional to the percentage of respondents mentioning this particular activity.

The "Gallup Big 6"

The Gallup-Purdue Index, through a study of 30,000 college graduates, identified six key elements of an undergraduate education that lead to graduates having a higher well-being and feeling more engaged in their work. Three of these relate to being supported at the institution (*support statements*) and the other three are about being active in campus experiences (*experiential statements*).
