

Events of 2018-19 involving Whitman-CTUIR collaboration

- August 25, 2018: For the third year in a row, *Home in Pásxapa* was a central component of the Orientation program for incoming Whitman students.
- March 9-16, 2019: *Wiyákitnaytút: Search for That to Bring Home*. Spring Break Service Trip to Mission, Oregon, focusing on natural resources conservation.
- April 11, 2019: Reception for community partners, including guests from CTUIR, took place at the Gesa Power House Theatre hosted by Center for Teaching and Learning included leadership from CTUIR.
