**Research Assistant,**

June - Aug 2021

Whitman College, Biology Department, Walla Walla, WA

- Collected over 950 flower-visiting insect specimens, keeping detailed records and following field safety guidelines to ensure minimal impact on habitat and flora
- Collaborated with other student researchers to pin, organize, identify, and label specimens from 4 projects to be used for thesis research project
- Analyzed and compiled numerical and biological data using Excel to be included in undergraduate thesis and to present findings at an Entomological Society of America conference and Whitman Undergraduate Conference (April 2022)

**Research Intern,** Glacier Peak Institute, Seattle, WA

September 2021 - Present

- Collected information on property taxes, land use, and ownership for over 37,000 properties spanning two counties to populate database for future project use
- Organized and integrated datasets using ArcGIS, R Studio, and Structured Query Language to enable variation-finding comparison
- Quantified the loss of property taxes in Darington and Concrete school district using R in order to determine future fund allocation
- Created a demographic comparison of Seattle City Light's service area using ArcGIS to be used for benchmarking purposes
